1. What three things are you most concerned about and would like to see changed as they relate to Hamilton's current infrastructure needs? *

- 1.) Public Safety - with respect to walking, cycling, buses & driving
- 2.) Additional community facilities for the community, especially Youth & Seniors
- 3.) Effective Water management systems - sewer & storm water systems

2. As a councillor, what three actions would you propose to improve Hamilton's infrastructure? *

- 1.) Public Safety - with respect to walking, cycling, buses & driving, improvements need to be undertaken, starting with a full analysis of the current systems in Ward 12. Identifying sidewalk improvements, additional safe & effective cycle lanes, as well as improving road surfaces, fixing potholes, and improving road markings for drivers, cyclists & pedestrians.
- 2.) Additional community facilities, especially for Youth & Seniors. The City provides incredible programs, though not in all Wards. These need to be reviewed and added to all Wards. One of the largest communities in Ward 12, the Meadowlands has no community centre or rec room, this needs to be looked at as a priority with its ever-growing population base.
- 3.) Effective Water management systems - sewer & stormwater systems, we all are aware of what has happened in the past, and our environment cannot afford to have this happen again. We need to effectively and sustainably improve the sewage systems in place and use modern dynamic thinking such as working with the Conservation Authority, for stormwater run-off areas, like Bioswales.

E - Economy

A leader who strengthens the overall financial health and prosperity of Hamilton and all its diverse residents, through better and more secure jobs, a living wage, housing availability and affordability, and access to public services.

- 1.) Public Safety - concerning walking, cycling, buses & driving, improvements need to be made. Identifying sidewalk improvements, additional safe & effective cycle lanes, as well as improving road surfaces, fixing potholes, and improving road markings for drivers, cyclists & pedestrians.
- 2.) Ward 12's transportation study had our population at 40,000 by 2031, as of 2022 we are at 42,000 plus residents. Steps are being taken, but we need to go further to improve transport in and around the greater Ancaster & Flamborough-West communities.
- 3.) Public transit needs to be affordable to all in the community, it needs to be timely and reliable to encourage public use across the board. It needs to make sense and have sustainable services that are timed and connected, building off of the LRT and BLAST transport plans.
